## **General Introduction:**

This report only comments on Environmental Health (EH) Impacts of the proposed development as outlined in this EIS and the adequacy of the EIS from an EH viewpoint.

**Application Summary:** 

The above application was referred to the Meath Environmental Health Service on the 15<sup>th</sup> October 2014.

This office is concerned primarily with highlighting issues of public health/environmental health concern. Our files indicate that this office has received no complaints in relation to this facility. Consultation with Mr. Andrew Sulley, Senior Environmental Health Officer took place on the 10<sup>th</sup> November 2014. The documentation submitted to Environmental Protection Agency was reviewed under the following headings:

- Traffic
- Air Quality
- Noise
- Water

## Assessment

A site visit was not possible as I was unable to make contact with the Company, Kiernan Sand & Gravel Ltd.

Noise monitoring to date has shown that site activity at the facility are within accepted thresholds for this type of development. Noise monitoring is monitored at three locations on a bi-annual basis.

The only dust generated by the operation will comprise of inert particulate matter. Dust deposition monitoring is carried out using Bergerhoff Dust Ganges. Two dust monitoring stations were established at the site boundary.

There are no surface water courses adjoining the site. There is no discharge of surface water run-off from the site. It is not considered necessary to monitor surface water in the area. There are three wells on site and these are used to monitor groundwater level and are sampled for chemical analysis.

## **Conclusion**

Having considered the documentation submitted, this department has no comments to make on the application.
