I write to you to express my concern and opposition at the recent proposal of Dublin Port to undertake a dredging project that will see 9.7 million tonnes of dredge waste into Dublin Bay.

As an avid scuba diver I have had the pleasure of diving on some of the historic ship wreaks lying in the bay. These wreaks are covered in fine silt which occurs naturally in the bay carried by the rivers that drain into dublin bay. As there are no ocean currents to wash them away the silt moves around with even a slight movment of water which can effect water clarity for days. If it is allowed to dump millions of tons of waste into the bay that extra silt will cover the sea floor for years to come which will stop all scuba diving in bublin as visibility will be reduced to zero something on a par with the colour of the liffey river flowing into the sea. As well as the clarity of water this extra silt will kill most of the sea plant life that inhabitants the sea bed which are filter feeders. Please take time to review some of the photos available on line that shows the wonderful marine environment that is right on our own doorstep and like me believe we need to protect this amenitie for the future.
