The destination of the dredged material must also be considered further by the EPA. The consequences on the environment of dumping the material on the suggested site must be fully thought through before any licence is granted to Dublin Port.

I ask the EPA to critically assess the consequences of Dublin Port's submission on the environment generally in the region in question before granting any permission to commence the work proposed.
