Dear Ms Kearey,

We have reviewed the application and associated documentation in respect of the above application and make the following observations;

- Ground preparation and associated construction works, including large-scale topographic alteration (as proposed), have significant potential to cause the release of sediments and pollutants into surrounding watercourses. Pollution of the adjacent freshwaters from poor on-site construction practices could have a significantly negative impact on the fauna and flora of this sensitive and important freshwater system.
- Any stockpiling of topsoil must be considered and planned such that risk of pollution from these activities is minimised. Drainage from the topsoil storage area may need to be directed to a settlement area for treatment.
- The wheel wash on site should receive regular inspection and maintenance, particularly the soakaway area mentioned as mitigation measures in the EIS.
- A quarantine area should be put in place in the event of contaminated material arriving on site. Mitigation procedures should be put in place to deal with such a scenario.
- All discharges must be in compliance with the European Communities (Surface Water) Regulations 2009 and the European Communities (Groundwater) Regulations 2010.

I trust you will take our observations on board when assessing this application.
