On behalf of the Department of Arts, Heritage and the Gaeltacht, I refer to the planning authority's notification in relation to the above.

Outlined below are the observations and recommendations of the Department in relation to archaeology.

The Department have examined the Cultural Heritage/Archaeological component of the EIS (Section 10) submitted in connection with the above planning application On the basis of the information of the EIS and the recommendations included, it is this Departments recommendation that the following condition pertaining to Archaeological Monitoring be included in any grant of planning permission that may issue.

Archaeological Monitoring shall consist of the following:

- 1. The applicant is required to employ a qualified archaeologist to monitor all groundworks or topsoil stripping associated with the development.
- 2. Should archaeological material be found during the course of monitoring, the archaeologist may have work on the site stopped, pending a decision as to how best to deal with the archaeology. The developer shall be prepared to be advised by the Department of Arts, Heritage and the Gaeltacht with regard to any necessary mitigating action (e.g. preservation in situ, or excavation) and should facilitate the archaeologist in recording any material found.
- 3. The Planning Authority and the Department of Arts, Heritage and the Gaeltacht shall be furnished with a report describing the results of the monitoring.

Reason:

To ensure the continued preservation (either *in situ* or by record) of places, caves, , features or other objects of archaeological interest.
