

I live very close to the facility and I am affected daily by their operation. The situation with regard to Dunbia has got considerably worse over the past 12 to 18 months and particularly since they got the last planning permission.

I have lived here since 1978 and this factory started as a very small operation and has now turned into a very large operation that is making life unbearable for me and my family.

The traffic has got very bad with the increase in HGVs making driving on our road very dangerous, and we can never consider walking on this road now.

we suffer constant light pollution as they never turn of the lights.

For the past number of years we have been worked about our well as it is the only source of water and we now buy water for drinking. The tailing ponds are directly across the road from our house. I can only imagine it will get worse if they increase their operation.

Years ago the opening times seemed to be confined to reasonable times but now it has turned into a 24 hour operation including Saturday and Sunday. I often here trucks coming and going in the small hours of the morning.

The noise from this factory has got worse and worse over the past years and is now unbearable, they show complete contempt for residents by blowing the horns in the lorries at all times of night and this along with the increase in working hours to 24 hours a day.

The smell coming from the factory has got very bad over the last year and a half, before it would only smell bad from time to time but now we regularly have to close our windows and we are very embarrassed when friends or family call.

This factory is making life unbearable and to consider giving them a licence to increase their operation for us would be a disaster.

Please do not grant the licence to increase their production
