I represent the members of the North West Charter Skipper's Association who are affiliated to the national Skippers Association and work closely with Irish Fisheries and Department of Marine.

Our members are small boats owners who live solely on taking groups out for fishing trips throughout the year. We are based in the North West, our members located from Rosses Point right up to Inishowen.

Whilst fishing has been in decline over the years for different reasons, we are very concerned of the possible knock on effects of silt drifting around the bay. Fishing and sightseeing is our only source of income, with the decline of fish and of whales/dolphin watching, it will put the few of us that is left out of business. We have already lost a few boats from our area due to the decline in fishing.

At a recent meeting, we have been made aware that Killybegs Harbour will be dredged during the coming months to clear the area for a proposed pier extension at Smooth Point.

Killybegs Harbour was dredged a couple of years ago, that and the red tide algae killed the fish which resulted in poor fishing trips that reduced to nothing. It took the fish two years to come back in any kind of stock and size that an Angler would pay money for.

We have worked closely with Inland Fisheries and Failte Ireland to help our declining industry. Inland Fisheries have promoted us with a newly launched website three years ago and are marketing our industry worldwide. Failte Ireland have promoted our industry and sightseeing trips on all their Wild Altantic Way platforms and have brought many Familisation trips and Travel Media throughout the world to promote Donegal Bay.
