I wish to make a complaint with regard to the application by Tara Mines for their IPC license, PO516 – 04, with regard to the position of the Site Notice for the license.

Having respect to,

S.I. No. 283/2013 - Environmental Protection Agency (Integrated Pollution Control) (Licensing) Regulations 2013,

5 of 14 pages
Section 7,

(iii) in either case, because of its content or for any other reason, is misleading or inadequate for the information of the public, the Agency shall require the applicant to publish, erect or fix such further notice in such manner, whether in a newspaper or otherwise, in such terms as it may specify and to submit to it such evidence as it may specify in relation to compliance with any such requirement.

The IPC license is to cover the Tailings Dump at Randlestown, site entrance off the Milestown road, yet the site notice was placed 11 km from the entrance.

Was this to mislead the public living in the area of the Tailings Dump and not inform them that a IPC license was being applied for by Tara Mines ?

It is my understanding that the site notice should be reissued and placed at the entrance to the Tailings Dump.
