# BEAG

## Ballyglasson Environmental Action Group

A recent Planning application for an extension of the Piggery at Ballyglasson, Edgeworthstown, Co. Longford was rejected by Longford County Council.

Reasons given for this decision included the following:

The Planning Authority (Longford county Council) were not satisfied that the proposed development, with the lack of specific detail in its EIAR would not give rise to the risk of pollution and pose a significant threat to the quality of ground and surface water.

Secondly, the Planning Authority, considered the EIAR submitted lacked specific detail in its assessment of environmental impact, waste, emissions and identification and impact on surrounding water courses...both individual and cumulative.

Thirdly, the Planning Authority was not satisfied that there was sufficient information ...to carry out a full EIA ...and as such, the proposed development would be contrary to the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.

BEAG welcomes this decision by Longford County Council *but believe it also has repercussions for the EPA* since the application related to an activity requiring an industrial emissions licence.

The concerns expressed by Longford County Council need to be taken on Board in the context of the EPA granting/renewing the industrial emissions licence for this operation
