To whom it may Concern,

On behalf Catherine and myself, we wish to inform Kildare County Council that we strongly oppose permission to grant a license to GCHL Ltd W0298-01 at Ballinderry, Carbury, Broadford, Co. Kildare.

We oppose it on the following basis:

1. Road Safety:

There our children are attending Broadford national school. The school is right beside the main road. Parking is limited outside the school which requires a lot of parents to park across the road and children to cross the road. When you take into account that 80 large trucks will be passing on a daily basis then this increases the risk to our children. Children's safety is paramount here and we need for this to be taken seriously.

2. Community Safety:

Our local roads are narrow and winding and are not built for these large vehicles. These roads are also sparsely supported by intermittent paths. There are a large number of local people and children walking or biking on the footpaths and roads to get to church or when out exercising. This guaranteed traffic will make the roads lethal to the local community.

3. Water Safety:

There was an epidemic with the local drinking water this year which raises serious concerns about such a dumping ground being so close to local houses and the school. The dumping area contains a lake and to date the water has not been tested. This does not make any sense from a health and safety point of view. E.Coli has been found in the local water. This can lead to gastrointestinal illness and could potentially result in server and long – term kidney failure. Further damage to the local water supply could put our children at further risk.

4. The Environmental Impact on the Eco System to the River Boyne:

Due to the fact that the River Glosk is a tributary of the river Boyne, I fear that this proposed project could have a serious impact to the Eco system of one of our main tourist attractions in the north east of the country. With all its folklore such as the salmon of knowledge to the historical monastic settlements and then on to Newgrange. As a polluted river will prevent the fishing touristed to come to the greater Boyne valley area. Along with the River Boyne been the water source for a large portion of the Meath/Louth areas.
