Thank you very much for sharing this application.

Three quick comments:

1. The Hammon lane metal squishing and export is on the S side of the Liffey estuary and from watching the loading I would expect some increase in heavy metal readings in sediments here. I see there is no sample site near there. Is that because no dredging is required in this area? Or if dredging is planned would it be wise to add a sample site here.
2. A quick look at the sediment analyses at the 12 sample sites show Dub S6 results to be significantly higher than the rest for a good few parameters (PAHs especially) Is there a logical reason for this? Should one take a second sample in the same area?
3. The government archaeologist note sets out requirements to be met re further checks of archaeology. What happens next?
