I wish to strongly object to the proposed application listed above.

I have operated a Sea Angling Business out of East Ferry for the last 30 years and have worked
for various Hydrographic Survey Companies in that period. I am amazed that this project has
been allowed to get this far with huge environmental issues involved and the damage it will do
to our local waters.

- (1) It is a myth to suggest that the waters of the East Ferry Channel totally flush out during
the twice daily tide change. They partly flush and they certainly don't reach Roches
Point in a tide change, as the major flow of tide comes down the River Lee and holds
back the waters of the East Ferry and surrounding areas. This is patently evident to
anyone using these waters on a daily basis.
- (2) The waters of East Ferry also clearly show that they don't flush on a daily basis as some
of the boats that are moored there, are not facing the prevailing tide whether it be the
flood tide or the ebb tide.

Cork Harbour has huge and continued potential for Sea Angling Tourism and is a safe haven for
Charter Skippers to operate their Angling Tourism boats in bad weather. Many of these Charter
Boats have been grant aided with EU Grants also small self-drive boats. There are many
International Angling Festivals hosted in Cork Harbour and the effect this will have on the
Tourism will be detrimental. There are many water based activities a lot involving children,
being carried out in the East Ferry and surrounding harbour area, sailing and rowing to mention
just two.
