I wish to strongly object to any license being granted to dairy gold Tine cheese plant in Mogeely for the discharge of their waste in the East Ferry Harbour at Rathcoursey.

There are many environmental concerns here and a lot have been conveyed in the other submissions, a lot more eloquently than I could. I have many grave concerns about the discharge of F.O. Gs into our harbour. Not only the environmental impacts on our native species but the pollution that this waste will cause to the greater cork harbour.

East ferry is one of our most beautiful and serene areas in East Cork. Its an area we are all proud of. From an economic point of view, to allow this license would be detrimental to the area.

I and my colleagues in Sinn Fein in East Cork are campaigning for the implementation of a Blueway in of which this area would be apart of.

Blueway's are a network of stunning trails running on and alongside Ireland's most idyllic lakes, canals and rivers. Taking you into the heart of her most unspoilt landscapes - by canoe, bike or on foot. As you meander through inspiring, picturesque vistas, soak in the charming rural atmosphere and explore life at a different pace.
