

I have lived for the last 33 years on the northern shore of Great Island and along with family and friends, and hundreds of thousands of others going back generations have been privileged to enjoy the unique and wonderful habitat and facility which is Cork Harbour. This harbour has to be carefully protected for the current and future generations.

I was delighted to receive in June 2019 a letter from the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht regarding the formal designation of Great Island Channel Special Area of Conversation, and noting the necessity of protection of the area under European Unions's Habitats Directive.
