The test in Irish Law for Appropriate Assessment Screening is in Kelly -v- An Bord Pleanála [2014] IEHC 400 (25 July 2014) and is.

26. There is a dispute between the parties as to the precise obligations imposed on the Board in relation to the stage 1 screening by s.1777U but its resolution is not strictly necessary in these proceedings. There is agreement on the nature and purpose of the screening process which is well explained by Advocate General Sharpston in Case C-258/11 Sweetman at paras 47-49:

"47. It follows that the possibility of there being a significant effect on the site will generate the need for an appropriate assessment for the purposes of Article 6(3). The requirement at this stage that the plan or project be likely to have a significant effect is thus a trigger for the obligation to carry out an appropriate assessment. There is no need to establish such an effect; it is, as Ireland observes, merely necessary to determine that there may be such an effect. (my emphasis)

It is necessary to perform an Appropriate Assessment according to the interpretations of the Directive by the CJEU. (The EPA does not have the right to deviate from these)

Any Environmental Impact Assessment must also be carried out according to the interpretations of the CJEU
