To whom it may concern,

I am sending this objection to the expansion or even the maintaining of the plant named above in its present capacity for the following reasons.

I am a long-term resident of Ferrybank and have been suffering with the odours from this site for years. Along with the stench that can drift up through Ferrybank, the worst part of the situation is the lorries passing through Ferrybank and other towns en route to their destination.

I have felt like vomiting on several occasions as one of the trucks passed. I travel on public transport and when stuck behind or indeed in any proximity to one of the lorries the smell traps inside the bus and holds on the way into Waterford city causing the people on the bus to gag, cover their faces and have to get off the bus early.

I have seen trails of foul-smelling liquids, pieces of animals all strewn in the road where these trucks have passed in a built up residential area.

There is also the smell from the plant itself. This is notable on evenings, sometimes on weekends where the smell will drift upwards through the most densely populated area of Ferrybank causing us to close the windows at the front of the house. God knows what the people living closer must have to suffer.

It must also be taken into consideration the location of the two schools, primary and secondary which lie within feet of the route. I can remember our daughter having to be protected from the stench as they left school as one of the trucks passed within two/three feet of them as they came out of the gate of the school, and she suffered this through her primary and secondary schooling.

Its location is no place for a plant of this nature amid a now densely populated urban location and I object in the strongest terms to it being sited there.
