ACTIVITY DETAILS

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ATTACHMENT B7

This Waste Licence Application provides for the remediation of three unauthorised landfill sites discovered between December 2002 and February 2003 on Roadstone Dublin's landholding in Dillonsdown, Deerpark, Newpaddocks townlands, Blessington, Co. Wicklow.

The proposed remediation scheme essentially comprises

- (i) excavation and removal of all buried domestic, commercial and industrial waste (including surrounding and intermixed soil) and overlying construction and demolition waste at each of three unauthorised landfill sites;
- (ii) segregation and recycling of a maximum of 120,000 tonnes of construction and demolition waste;
- (iii) segregation and off-site removal of hazardous waste (if any);
- (iv) disposal of a maximum of 180,000 tonnes of residual non-hazardous domestic, commercial or industrial waste at an engineered landfill within the Applicant's landholding in Dillonsdown townland;
- (v) backfilling and restoration of unauthorised landfill sites using inert soils and
- (vi) long-term monitoring of all environmental emissions.

The **Principal Activity** is Class 1 of the Third Schedule of the Waste Management Acts (1996-2003) – deposit on, in or under land (including landfill).

Other activities are Class 5 of the Third Schedule (specially engineered landfill), Class 13 of the Third Schedule (temporary storage pending disposal), Class 4 of the Fourth Schedule (recycling or reclamation of inorganic materials), Class 10 of the Fourth Schedule (treatment of waste on land with a consequential benefit for an agricultural activity or ecological system) and Class 13 of the Fourth Schedule (temporary storage pending recycling).

Full details of the proposed remediation scheme are provided in Section 2 of the Environmental Impact Statement.

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
