re: Notice in accordance with Article 8 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations

Dear Mr Luby

I am to refer to the above referenced application for a waste licence relating to a facility at Roadstone Dublin Remediation Landfill, Dillonsdown, Deerpark, Newpaddocks and Santryhill Townlands, Blessington. I am directed to advise you of a failure of compliance with Articles 6 and 7 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations. The notice published in respect of the application contravenes Articles 6 (c), 7 (2), and 7 (3)(b)of the regulations.

The Agency therefore requires you, in accordance with Article 8(b) of the regulations, to:

- 1. Re-publish the newspaper and site notices and specify the class or classes of activity concerned, in accordance with the Third and Fourth Schedules of the Acts. The wording used should be identical to that used in the Third and Fourth Schedules of the Acts. No alterations to the text, e.g., additions to text, are accepted. Ensure that the Third and Fourth Schedule Activities identified in the newspaper notice directly reflect those in the application form and the site notice.
- 2. The site notice shall be fixed in FOUR conspicuous <u>positions</u> on the premises such that it is easily visible and legible by persons outside the facility since the application for a waste licence does not adjoin a public road. Erect an <u>A3</u> sized notice at four positions: the main gate as already fixed, a position at the Roadstone/New Paddocks new housing development (Woodleigh Way), the new steel fencing/roundabout/new inner relief road directly south of Area 6, in the townland of Blessington Demense, and the northern entrance at JW Carnegie, Dillonsdown, north of Area 1.
- 3. Amend Drawing B2.1 accordingly.



The Agency further requires you to submit the following evidence in relation to compliance with the above requirement: Copies of the revised newspaper and site notices, and an amended version of Drawing B2.1.

The evidence requested should be submitted within 3 weeks of the date of this notice, in the form of a one original plus three copies. In addition submit one copy on a CD-ROM to the Agency. The e-file should be saved as a 'pdf' file.
