Proposed Decision

On the basis of the information available to it, the Agency, pursuant to its powers under Section 40(1) of the Waste Management Act, 1996, hereby refuses to grant a waste licence to Dean Waste Company Limited, Greenview, Greenhills Road, Walkinstown, Dublin 12 to carry on the waste activities that are the subject of waste licence application register number 135-1 at Townland of Carrowmoneash, Oranmore, Co. Galway.

In reaching this decision the Agency has considered the application and supporting documentation received from the applicant, all submissions received from other parties and the report of its inspector.

Activities Refused

Refused waste disposal activities, in accordance with the Third Schedule of the Waste Management Act, 1996
