Dear Ms. Hermansen,

I refer to the application by Greenstar Ltd to review the Waste Licence for its Fassaroe Depot Materials Recovery and Transfer Facility, the purpose of which is to amend certain conditions of the existing licence. In addition to those conditions referenced in the review application, which was submitted to the Agency in September 2004, Greenstar Ltd wishes to amend the following: -

- Condition 1.6.1 to allow waste to be accepted at the facility on a twenty four hour a day basis from Monday to Sunday inclusive,
- Condition 1.6.2 to allow the facility to operate outside the current licensed operating hours inside the newly constructed waste transfer building; and
- Condition 1.6.3 to allow waste to be accepted at the site on Bank Holidays.

The grounds for seeking the review of Conditions 1.6.1 and 1.6.3 are to meet customer demands that wastes be collected from commercial activities at times that do not interfere with their trading operations and to minimise the accumulation of wastes at the point of generation over the weekends and public holidays. The grounds for seeking the review of Condition 1.6.2 are to ensure unprocessed waste does not accumulate at the facility and to allow the introduction of a shift work system to facilitate efficient compliance with statutory requirements on working hours.
