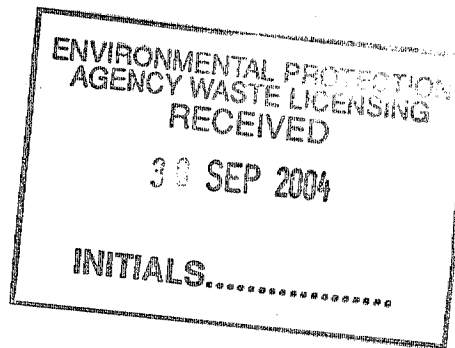

Dear Mr Watson,

I refer to the Waste License Review by greenstar Ltd. in respect of lands at Fassaroe, Bray, Co Wicklow.

This site is located adjacent to the Glenmunder River which ultimately drains into the River Dargle, a significant Salmonid river.

The Glenmunder River at this location is a spawning and nursery channel for brown trout. Any discharge of inadequately treated surface water to the system at this location could endanger its spawning and recruitment capacity.

However, the Board has no objection to the application from a fisheries perspective provided the following applies:

All roof water and contaminated yard water, including wheel wash are adequately collected, stored and safely disposed of in accordance with Section 3.11 of Waste License 53-2. The installation of petrol/oil interceptors would also be essential.

Sewage/process wastewater from the site will discharge to the foul sewer and in turn directly to the municipal wastewater treatment plant in Bray.

All tanks and drum storage areas are managed in accordance with Section 3.10 of Waste License 53-2.

All storage capacity for process water/leachate that that might be generated is adequate. Storage tanks should be properly sealed and alarmed.

In addition, we suggest that all maintenance be carried out on a regular basis to ensure that there are no discharges of leachate, wastewater or contaminated surface water to the Glenmunder River at any time.

Finally, copies of results to date of the surface and ground water analysis are requested as per Table D.5.1, Schedule D, Waste License 53-2.
