Dear Ms Burke

I am to refer to your letter of 9 April 2002, addressed to Dr Ken Macken, requesting confirmation that the above proposed Waste Management Facility will require an IPC/Waste Licence.

From the information available to the Agency about the proposed activities, the facility requires a licence from the Agency. As you are aware, Indaver Ireland submitted an application for a Waste Licence to the Agency on 5 December 2001 (Register No. 167-1). I would refer you to the Agency's letter of 14 February 2002 to Indaver Ireland in relation to that application, and in relation to the requirement for a licence from the Agency for the activities concerned (copy attached).

The Agency is examining the waste licence application as required under the Waste Licensing Regulations and has requested additional information from Indaver Ireland, by notice dated 8 April 2002, for compliance with the Regulations. On receipt of Indaver Ireland's response to same and to our letter of 14 February 2002, the Agency will proceed as appropriate in relation to the requirement for a licence in this case.
