Dear Mr Cooney,

I am to acknowledge receipt of your correspondence to the Agency dated 08/12/04 received on 13/10/04, in relation to the above referenced waste licence application.

I refer to the Agency's notification to you on 26 October 2004 informing you of its proposed decision on the above application. The proposed decision sets out the requirements in relation to objections in accordance with the Waste Management Acts, 1996 to 2003 and associated Regulations.

I am to advise that, as the application process has reached the stage where the Agency has made its proposed decision, the Agency is prohibited from considering any objection which does not fulfil the requirements of Section 42 of the Waste Management Acts, 1996 to 2003. As your correspondence does not fulfil those requirements, for the reasons set out below, the Agency cannot consider it and consequently it is returned herewith.

Section 42(3) of the Acts


Objection received after the expiration of the appropriate period, i.e. 22/11/04
