As soon as the Proposed Decision is issued to the Applicant and the Submittors there will be a month's deadline for receipt of Objections. There is a fee of €190.46 for an objection and an extra €63.49 for a request for an oral hearing which can be made at the same time.

The Agency's board will decide whether to grant a Final Licence or not and also on the Licence's conditions.
