APPLICATION TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR THE REVIEW OF A WASTE LICENCE

AVR-Safeway Ltd., with registered offices at Corrin, Fermoy, Co. Cork, is applying to the Environmental Protection Agency for a Review of Waste Licence 50-1 in respect of its facility at Corrin, Fermoy, Co. Cork, with National Grid Reference 1813E, 9527N.

The following will be constructed in addition to the existing waste transfer station facilities:

Fuel Blending Facility consisting of 6 number above ground liquid storage tanks (T-1 - T-6) ranging in capacity from 29 to 150 m³, ancillary piping, pumps (3 number), bund, control system and a wet scrubber carbon filter pollution abatement device.

Extension to the existing warehouse of about 240 m² and a new canteen.

Relocation of existing and installation of 2 number external storage boxes.

It is proposed to manage up to 72,000 tonnes/annum of commercial and industrial waste, primarily hazardous.

The relevant waste disposal and waste recovery activities, as per the New Third and Fourth Schedules of the Waste Management Acts 1996 to 2003, and the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations, 2004 (S.I. No. 395 of 2004) to which this application relates are:

Cork City Council proposes to make the following additions to its Record of Protected Structures, pursuant to its powers under the above mentioned Acts. The structures, or specified part of a structure, to be added are:
