We are also currently undertaking dispersion modeling for the discharge to ensure that it meets the requirements of the EPA.

I attach, for your consideration, the emission limits proposed by the waste water treatment company and I would be grateful if you could review same and let me know if you are satisfied with them. I will also furnish you with a copy of the dispersion model results when they are available.



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I refer to your letter 21st April 2005 to Sanitary Authority Youghal. I have reviewed the document on their behalf.

At present there is no Council wastewater treatment plant is Youghal Town. The proposed plant is under appeal with An Bord Pleanala.

Due to the fact that there is no existing treatment plant, the proposed discharge concentration limits as stated in the Table 3 (ii) from emission point SE 1 are too high to be allowed discharge directly to sewer. Additional on-site treatment should be considered.

I have observed also, that there is no information provided on volatile organics and micro organic compounds, no chemical oxygen demand or sulphate concentrations and very limited information on heavy metals.

If the applicant wishes to supply future information to support this application, the Sanitary Authority will reassess the application. As I am taking up a new post within the Council, I will not be handling future correspondence in relation to this file. New contact person is Mr Macdara O' Hici acting senior executive officer, at Environment Department, Inniscarra.
