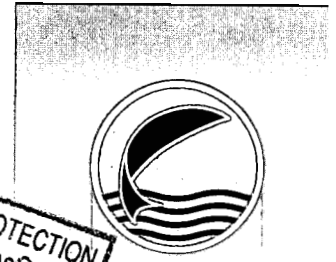

Waste Licence Application Ref. 50-2 AVR Safeway, Corrin, Fermoy, Co. Cork.

I refer to the above application. It is noted from the application that it is proposed to discharge sewage and wash water (currently tankered to Fermoy WWTP) to an expanded Fermoy sewer network some time in the future. There is no reference to the time scale of such works. The application proposes a normal emission per day of 30 cu.m with a BOD of 3000mg/l. This constitutes a loading of 90 kg BOD/day. This is equivalent to load of 1500 p.e. (assuming a per capita load of 60g/day). The licencing of such a discharge confers on the applicant a legal entitlement to discharge to sewer. In this regard the Council need to be cognisant of its commitment to treat the effluent load and must
