Re: Waste Licence Application, Lawlor Brothers Waste Disposal, Unit 28, JFK Road, JFK Industrial Estate, Dublin 12.

Dear Miss Bosley,

In relation to the above waste application, please find below a list of the Board's observations:

- The surface water from the site will be discharging to the Camac River, a tributary of the River Liffey, a salmonid system. It is important to note that the Camac River itself supports populations of Brown trout, thus highlighting the importance of pollution control at this site. Only clean, uncontaminated water can be discharged to local surface waters.
- As outlined in the EIS, best available technology must be applied and comprehensive mitigation measures must be fully implemented to ensure protection of the local and downstream surface water system. It is important to note that comprehensive on-site housekeeping and infrastructural initiatives are required in order to achieve this goal. A primary measure would be to install silt and particularly petrol / oil interception structures on the primary surface water discharge. Any interceptor mechanisms must be regularly inspected and maintained to ensure its effectiveness.
- Weekly and preferably daily visual inspections of storm water would be recommended for inclusion in the licence conditions.
