I wish to object to the granting of a licence for the above application by Brownfield Restoration-Ltd., on the following grounds:-

- 1. Such a development would have a detrimental affect on the surrounding area. It would attract vermin, flies and scavenging birds all of which could carry and spread bacteria to the surrounding area., creating a health hazard to the population of the area which includes two primary schools situated within 5km of the illegal dumps.
- 2. The Whitestown site is far too close to the Carrigower River which is a salmon spawning area situated in a designated "Special Area of Conservation" and any pollution of these waters would be catastrophic. This area is also a wildlife habitat and a flood plain and is protected by European Union regulations. No interference or threats of any kind to this Special Area of Conservation should be allowed. The illegal waste that is already on the Whitestown site should be removed immediately to prevent any further pollution of the Carrigower and Slaney river systems by toxic leachate from this waste.
- 3. The N81 is possibly the most dangerous national road in the country and the National Roads Authority have no immediate plans to improve it. The entrance to the Whitestown site is situated in an area where there are roads signs alerting drivers to dangerous bends for 3km. This proposed development would bring a major increase in traffic on the N81. The road would become much more dangerous and that is totally unacceptable.
- 4. The enormous amount of illegal waste that is already on this site should be removed and disposed of safely, not added to by bringing countless thousands of tons more waste into the area The cost of the clean-up should be borne by those who dumped the waste illegally. The Polluters should pay and NOT profit from the environmental damage they have caused to this area.

I urge you to protect our environment and not grant a li	icence for this landfill project.
