AT TOOMAN / NEVITT, LUSK, Co. DUBLIN.

Sir/Madam.

I would like to voice my strong  
opposition to F.C.C. plans to site a dump  
in this beautiful area of North County Dublin.  
Toomin / Nevitt is one of the last large green  
belts in North Dublin to place a dump  
here is unthinkable.

① There is a vast array of Wildlife in the  
area and surrounding, many of whom are  
protected. An example being the Buzzard  
which has only just returned to the East  
of Ireland. A landfill would be devastating  
to them and their habitat.

② Pollution of the water table which feeds into  
the rivers, streams, wells and holy wells used  
by Wildlife, livestock and domestic dwellings.

③ The close proximity of Hedgestown National  
School, were many of our children and  
grand children attend.

Developing children have no defense against the toxic chemicals and pollutants that a large landfill will bring.

④ The increase in heavy vehicle traffic in a rural community with small roads and no foot paths, the increase in air and noise pollution their large diesel engines produce will be considerable.

⑤ Valuable archeology on the site (which F.C.C. has acknowledged) will be destroyed.

⑥ The dusk community has had to live with a large landfill in Belleley for almost 30 yrs. to locate a super dump in the same community is unthinkable.

⑦ The Environmental Impact Study of F.C.C. does not satisfactorily deal with any of the above.

My family, friends and I have lived on and worked the land of this large community for generations. We had hoped to continue to do so in relative peace, good health and to have a decent quality of life for the future.
