

We wish to object to the application for a Waste Licence for the proposed landfill at Nevitt Lusk Co Dublin by Fingal County Council

- 1. The proposed landfill has not received pranning permission and Fingal County Council owns less than one seventh of the land needed.
- 2. Part of the land owned by Fingal County Council is described in the E.I.S as contaminated land. Fingal County Council has made no attempt to clean up this land and fix this problem.
- 3. Fingal County Council has not sought or received permission from us to apply for a waste licence to dump on our home or land.
- 4. I will lose my home.
- 5. Disruption and upset of families living at Nevitt for generations. No regard for their wellbeing or relocation.
- 6. Placing a second landfill in Lusk despite assurance from Fingal County.

 Council that there would not be another landfill in Lusk.
- 7. Danger of contamination to water supply at Ring Commons.

- 8. Danger of bird strikes to aircraft due to close proximity of Dublin Airport.
- 9. Health risks to local children in Hedgestown National School.
- 10. The area is rich in wildlife.
- 11. The area is also very scenic.
- 12. The elevation of the land is much higher than the land to the east or south so this proposed-landfill-will-be-seen for miles. Standing-in my-garden-I-can-seeeast to the sea from Lambay to Howth and can easily pick out various landmarks as far as Dublin city centre and further on to the Dublin Wicklow mountains.
