

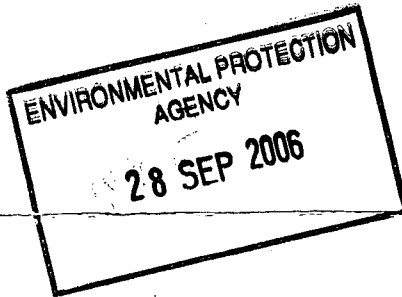

To Whom It May Concern:

I write on behalf of concerned farmers in North Dublin with reference to the proposed construction of a waste landfill by Fingal County Council.

Farming is an industry highly dependent on a fresh water supply for livestock and for crop irrigation.

North Dublin is an area with a high concentration of horticultural growers. These growers depend on the underground aquifer for a supply of water. Farmers and growers have raised concerns that this aquifer may become contaminated by the landfill.

I would appreciate if you would revert back to me and inform me of what measures are proposed to ensure contamination of water does not occur by this landfill.
