## Notice in accordance with Article 8 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations

Dear Mr Quirke

I am to refer to the above referenced application for a waste licence relating to a facility at Ormonde Waste Limited, Carrigbawn, Pembrokestown, Wexford, I am directed to advise you of a failure of compliance with Article 6 and 7 of the relevant Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations. The notice as erected or fixed on the facility or premises contravenes Article 6(c) and 7(3)(b) of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations 2004, S.I. No. 395 of 2004.

- 1. The notices do not identify the principal activity
- 2. The notices specify that Classes 11 and 13 of the Third Schedule of the waste Management Act 1996 are being applied for, however, this conflicts with the Waste Licence Review application which identifies Classes 11, <u>12</u> and 13 as the Classes of activity being applied for under the Third Schedule.

The Agency therefore requires you, in accordance with Article 8 of the regulations, to

- 1. Publish an amended newspaper notice in accordance with Article 6 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations 2004, S.I. No 395 of 2004. The notice should be published in the newspaper which carried the original notice.
- 2. Replace the existing site notice with an amended notice that complies with Article 7 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations.
- 3. Maintain the notice as amended at a location complying with Article 7 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations for a period of two months following the making of the specified amendment.

- 4. An amended written notice should be given to the relevant planning authority in accordance with Article 9 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations including the specified amendments.
- 5. The above requirements should be carried out within two (2) weeks of the date of this notice.

The Agency further requires you to submit the following evidence in relation to compliance with the above requirement:

- 1. An original of the newspaper and two copies of the relevant page of the newspaper in which the amended notice has been published.
- 2. An original and two copies of both a letter stating the date on which the amended site notice was fixed and a drawing showing its location on site.
- 3. An original and two copies of the text of the amended notice erected or fixed in accordance with Article 7.
- 4. An original and two copies of the amended written notice to the relevant planning authority in accordance with Article 9.

The evidence requested should be submitted within two (2) weeks of the date of this notice, in the form of a one original plus two copies. Please note that all drawings/maps should not exceed A3 in size.
