Re: **Technical Amendment - Mulleady's Ltd., Cloonaugh, Drumlish, Co. Longford**

To Whom It May Concern:

We acknowledge receipt of email received on September 27th 2005 (copy attached).
We wish to apply for a Technical Amendment of the following:

- Emergency Driveway Access to adjoining Precast plant for Recycling Plant and Vehicle Repairs.**

Longford Precast is a sister company adjoining Mulleady's Ltd. waste management facility. Within Longford Precast is an engineering department and a garage. Longford Precast is contracted to carry out all maintenance work on all our plant, both static and mobile on our site.

It is a major inconvenience and a high risk health and safety issue removing mobile plant out onto the R198 crossing the line of traffic coming from Longford utilising the main facility entrance. Whether the vehicle or mobile plant is driven or towed it has to travel 100 metres from the waste facility entrance to enter the Precast facility. The vehicle has to cross the line of traffic coming from Longford again to enter Longford Precast Ltd. yard (sketch enclosed confirming this route).

We have suggested to Mr. Kealan Reynolds (Inspector) at the EPA Castlebar office that we would like to propose to fit an electrically operated sliding gate incorporating a personnel gate within it. This gate would be opened and closed by a remote control fob which would be operated by select staff and opened for maintenance purposes only.

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2. C & D Waste – Mulleady's Ltd.

Regarding C&D waste our site is quite low on the Northern side and requires raising up the ground by approximately 1 metre to bring it up to existing concrete levels. The material we propose to use would be all inert clean material from our waste collection activities. We propose to use clean waste concrete blocks, bricks, waste concrete and subsoil etc.


There would be no ecosystem on the site compromised. A survey was carried out by Dr. Monica O'Sullivan of Environmental Services Ireland in April 2002 and there are no rare flora or fauna found within the facility boundaries. Common grasses and common species of gorse and bramble are the main species present.

The benefit of using recycled waste would be a saving to us where we would have no choice but to use virgin quarry material. The reuse of C&D waste for commercial purposes would be in keeping with National EPA Policy to reuse as much waste material as possible.

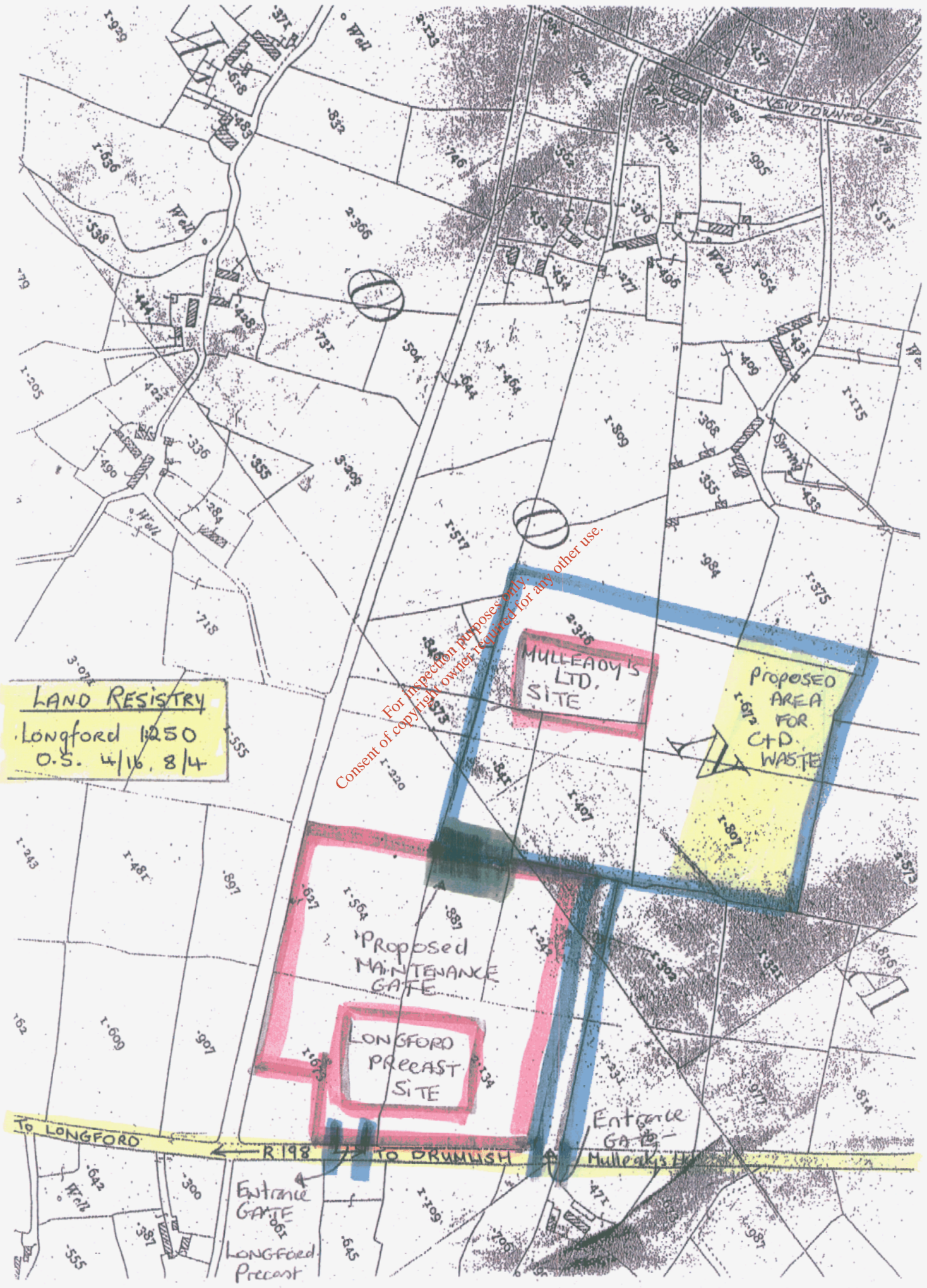
We hope you look favorably at our application for a technical amendment to our waste licence (EPA Waste Licence No. 169-1).

With regard to the proposed amendments for your facility I think it will be possible for your licence to be amended with regard to re-use of C&D waste at the facility and access to adjacent site under the terms of a technical amendment. You will have to submit a letter to the licensing unit outlining the two issues and providing a justification for the amendment of your existing licence. With regard to the re-use of C&D waste at the facility it would have to be shown that the material would meet the following:

- it is for the purposes of yard construction
- inert waste
- depth of fill <2m
- no protected ecosystem/site compromised
- beneficial use of recycled waste

The access to the adjoining site should also be justified in writing.

Such a proposal should be submitted (clearly indicating that you are applying for technical review) to the Licensing Section,
