re: Notice in accordance with Article 8 of the Waste Management (Licensing)
Regulations

Dear Mr Walsh

I am to refer to the above referenced application for a waste licence relating to a facility at Waterford City Composting Facility, Green Road, Waterford City. I am directed to advise you that it appears to the Agency that the notices published and erected or fixed in relation to the application do not comply with Article 6 and 7 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations 2004 (S.I. 395/2004).

- 1. The notice published in respect of the application does not state that the application for a waste licence and such further information relating to the application as may be furnished to the Agency will be available for inspection or purchase at the principal office of the local authority.
- 2. The notice erected or fixed in respect of the application does not state that the application for a waste licence and such further information relating to the application as may be furnished to the Agency will be available for inspection or purchase at the principal office of the local authority.
- 3. There are conflicting names and addresses for the applicant on the notice published and the noticed erected or fixed in relation to the application, clarify this issue.

The Agency therefore requires you, in accordance with Article 8 of the regulations, to

- 1. Publish an amended newspaper notice in accordance with Article 6 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations. The notice should be published in the newspaper which carried the original notice.
- 2. Replace the existing site notice with an amended notice that complies with Article 7 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations.
- 3. Maintain the notice as amended at a location complying with Article 7 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations for a period of two months following the making of the specified amendments.



- 4. An amended written notice should be given to the relevant planning authority in accordance with Article 9 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations including the specified amendments.
- 5. The above requirements should be carried out within two weeks of the date of this notice.

The Agency further requires you to submit the following evidence in relation to compliance with the above requirement:

- 1. An original of the newspaper and two copies of the relevant page of the newspaper in which the amended notice has been published.
- 2. An original and two copies of both a letter stating the date on which the amended site notice was fixed and a drawing showing its location on site.
- 3. An original and two copies of the text of the amended notice erected or fixed in accordance with Article 7.
- 4. An original and two copies of the amended written notice to the relevant planning authority in accordance with Article 9.

The evidence requested should be submitted within two weeks of the date of this notice, in the form of a one original plus two copies. In addition submit two copies of the requested information in electronic searchable PDF format on a CD-ROM to the Agency. Please note that all drawings/maps should not exceed A3 in size.

Please note that the format of the application's register number has been revised to W0234-01.
