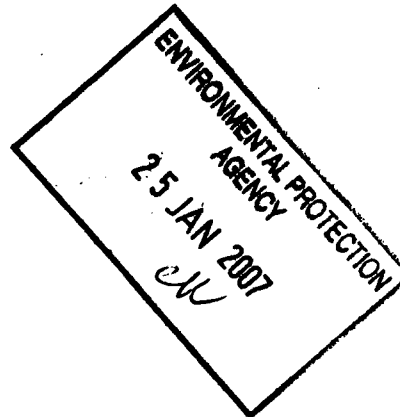

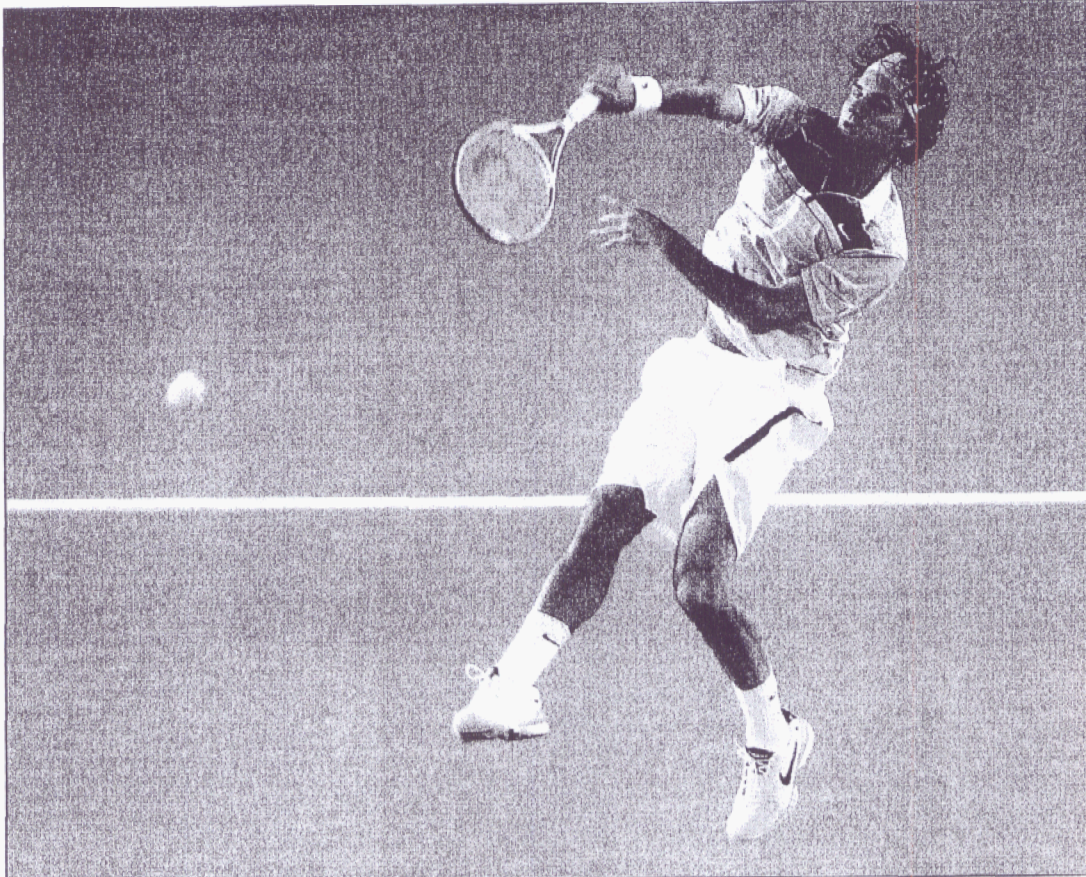

Roddick survives marathon encounter with Ancic

ANDY RODDICK won through to the quarter-finals of the Australian Open after a rollercoaster match against Croatian Mario Ancic on day seven.

Roger Federer also cleared his fourth-round hurdle when he cruised past Novak Djokovic, with seventh seed Tommy Robredo, Czech Tomas Berdych and German 12th seed Tommy Haas the other winners.

Roddick and Ancic traded sets in the 183-minute encounter with the American eventually taking the match 6-3 3-6 6-1 5-7 6-4.

It was Roddick's second epic in a row after the world number seven went to four sets, including two tiebreakers, against Marat Safin in his physical third-round encounter.

It has been well documented that Roddick has worked hard with new coach Jimmy Connors, and according to Roddick the former grand slam winner has been providing him with plenty of

useful advice between matches.

"If you're already in a slam and something needs a major overhaul, I'm afraid it's a little bit too late," Roddick said.

"But (he has) definitely (been giving me) little hints here and there during a warm up, during a day off."

Roddick has another tough task ahead in the quarters, where he will meet his old high-school friend Mardy Fish after the unseeded American continued his run through the tournament.

Fish knocked out fourth seed Ivan Ljubicic in his first-round clash and was handed a free ticket through the third round after Australian veteran, Wayne Arthurs, retired just three games into their match.

He went on to beat Spanish 16th seed David Ferrer today in the fourth round 6-1 7-6 (7-4) 2-6 7-5.

"I'd lost to him the last two times we played," Fish said. "We've played in some pretty big matches, but not like that."

Fish sent down 15 aces, but made a massive 55 unforced errors, which he will look to rectify against Roddick.

In the night session at Melbourne Park, exciting youngster Novak Djokovic was pitted against Federer and no matter what the Serb threw at the Swiss master, Federer returned it with interest.

The number 12 seed has not dropped a set in his first three matches and hopes to be fresh for the four-round match against David Nalbandian, even though massive forehands and powerful backhands have caused havoc on day six.

That meant that a number of matches had to be held over to today.

Tommy Haas finally began his match against compatriot Florian Mayer, 24 hours after the original scheduled time.

Haas was too strong for his opponent who spent a large proportion of 2006 on the Challenger Circuit - he took the match in straight sets 6-2 6-3 6-3 6-3.

Mauresmo bows out in day of shocks

DEFENDING champion Amelie Mauresmo's surprise defeat to Czech youngster Lucie Safarova capped off a day of shocks in the fourth round of the Australian Open in Melbourne.

Safarova - a few weeks shy of her 20th birthday - took the match in straight sets 6-4 6-3 after second seed Mauresmo struggled to combat her hard hitting style.

There were more upsets on day seven, with third seed and 2004 US Open winner Svetlana Kuznetsova and ninth seed Dinara Safina both bundled out in straight sets.

Safarova, the world number 70, burst from the blocks and had two break points in Mauresmo's first service game.

Mauresmo managed to hold and took a 4-1 lead in the first set before Safarova made her move.

"I was trying to be more aggressive," Safarova said.

"When I was playing against a big player before, I was still hurrying too much on the court and making so many mistakes."

She managed to cut out the mistakes and scored 12 points in a row to level the first set and then went on to take it 6-4.

The tide turned in the second set with the quiet Czech girl racing to 4-1.

She soon had two match points on her French opponent's serve, but had to wait until her next service game before she managed to close the match out.

"I'm so happy to win. I can't believe I did it."

Mauresmo struggled to compre-

hend her loss and her overall form at Melbourne Park this year.

"The disappointment is here," the French star said.

"I'm just trying to analyse (it) a little bit, the way I played not only today, but also throughout the tournament."

"I didn't really feel that I was really getting into the tournament just the way I wish I would."

Safarova will meet 10th seed Nicole Pietrangeli in her first grand slam quarter-final after Vaidisova beat Russian Elena Dementieva 6-3 6-3.

Vaidisova helped her own cause by firing down 27 winners in the 68-minute match.

Meanwhile, Kuznetsova fell to 16th seed Israeli Shahar Pe'er in their fourth-round encounter.

Pe'er, a mixed doubles partner to British number one Andy Murray in the past, recovered from a break down early on to take the match 6-4 6-2.

"I just went out there and gave everything, played my game," Pe'er said.

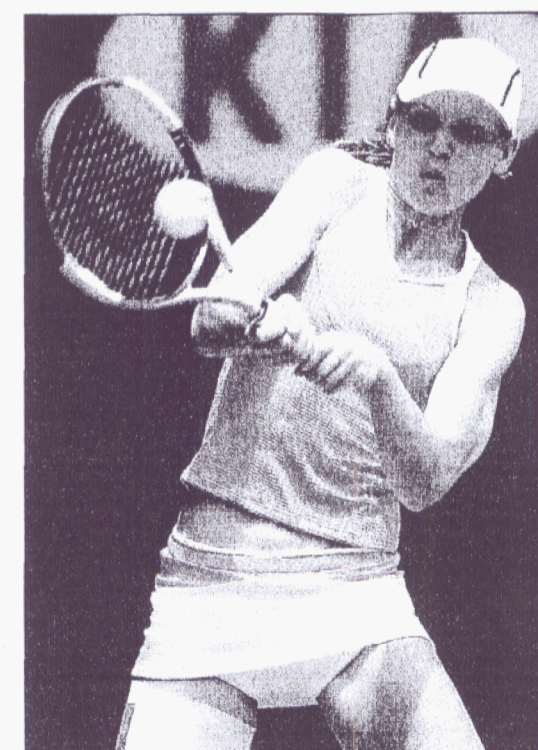
The Israeli will face in-form world number 47, Serena Williams.

"Serena, she's a great champion. She's won so many Grand Slams," the 19-year-old Israeli added.

"I'm just going to have to go out there like today and give everything I have."

Williams completely overpowered Jelena Jankovic 6-3 6-2 at the Rod Laver Arena.

The American, who won this tournament in 2003 and 2005, ran her higher-ranked opponent ragged just as she had done to world number six Nadia Petrova in

her third-round match.

There were three third-round matches carried over after a lengthy rain delay halted play on day six.

China's Na Li wiped Safina off the court with a 6-2 6-2 victory.

Li, the first Chinese person to reach a grand slam quarter-final, got 75% of her first serves in and smacked 24 winners at world number 10 Safina to win through to the fourth round.

Li faces a tough task next, though, as she will be up against three-time Australian Open win-

ner Martina Hingis, who will go into the match with an extra day's break.

Slovakian Daniela Hantuchova had a battle on her hands against unseeded American Ashley Harkleroad.

The 15th seed lost the first set in a lengthy tie-break, but took the match 6-7 (6/8) 7-5 6-3.

Hantuchova will meet one of the tournament favourites, Kim Clijsters, while Anna Chakvetadze - who beat Jelena Kostanic-Tosic 6-4 6-4 - will meet eighth seed Patty Schnyder.

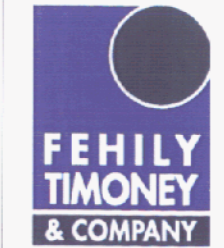

This will entail the upgrading of the existing composting facility in order to process up to 20,000 tpa of source-separated biodegradable municipal waste and green waste. It will involve in-tunnel composting and turned aerated static piles within a building. Plant used will comprise shredding, mixing equipment, screening and loading/pile turning machinery. Associated waste and compost storage infrastructure, site offices and vehicle parking will be provided.

The classes of activity applied for, are as set out in the Third and Fourth Schedules to the Waste Management Acts 1996 to 2005:

Third Schedule – Waste Disposal Activities

Class 7. Physico-chemical treatment not referred to elsewhere in this Schedule which results in final compounds or mixtures which are disposed of by means of any activity referred to in paragraphs 1 to 5 or paragraphs 8 to 10 of this Schedule (including evaporation, drying and calcination).

Class 13. Storage prior to submission to any activity referred to in a preceding paragraph of this Schedule, other than temporary storage, pending collection, on the premises where the waste concerned is produced.

Fourth Schedule – Waste Recovery Activities

Class 2. Recycling or reclamation of organic substances which are not used as solvents (including composting and other biological processes).

Class 13. Storage of waste intended for submission to any activity referred to in a preceding paragraph of this Schedule, other than temporary storage, pending collection, on the premises where such waste is produced.

The principal activity proposed is Class 2 of the Fourth Schedule as given above.
