Extract from the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations

Submissions to the Agency regarding applications.

For the purpose of Section 40(2)(b) of the Acts, a person may make a written submission to the Agency in relation to -

an application, and

such plans, documents and other information and particulars, including an environmental impact statement, as are submitted by the applicant in accordance with articles 12, 13, 14 and 16,

and the Agency shall not give notice of a proposed decision under section 42(2) of the Acts before the expiry of a period of one month following the date of a relevant -

acknowledgement in accordance with Article 14(2)(a), or

notice in accordance with Article 16(2)(a), or (b)

(c) acknowledgement in accordance with Article 16(4).

whichever such date is the later.

The Agency will have regard to any submission made in accordance with the Regulations and will write, in due course, to each person who makes such a submission, to advise them of the Agency's proposed decision on the application.
