Re: Notice in accordance with Article 14(2)(b)(ii) of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations

Dear Mr. Dowling,

I am to refer to the above referenced application for a waste licence relating to a facility at Waterford Utility Services (Waste Disposal) Ltd, Six Cross Roads, Carriganard, Butlerstown, Co. Waterford. Having examined the documentation submitted, I am to advise that the Agency is of the view that the documentation does not comply with Article 12 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations.

You are therefore requested, in accordance with Article 14(2)(b)(ii) of the regulations, to take the steps and supply the information detailed below:

ARTICLE 12 COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Clarify proposed hours of operation and hours of waste acceptance, and also the number of employees at the facility. Provide details of landuse zoning in the vicinity of the facility.
- Resubmit the Site Layout to include all storage areas, vehicle parking, loading & unloading areas, and any waste stored externally. Submit a scaled internal floor plan of the waste transfer building, including bays, waste inspection areas, quarantine areas, civic amenity area, and where booms or spill kits are located.
- Provide further details on proposals for a civic amenity facility, including a layout design, location, access, traffic management, parking, infrastructure, type of receptacles, and waste types to be accepted, and how it will be integrated with the remainder of the site.



- Provide a justification for the proposed increase from 15,000 to 70,000tpa and include further evidence that the facility, buildings and plant have the capacity for the tonnage applied for. Provide an outline programme of works in support of measures necessary to upgrade the site to BAT standards.
- Submit a site drainage plan showing storm and foul systems, location of gullies, oil interceptor(s), tanks and locations of emission points and proposed sewer connection etc. Provide a written description of both systems.
- Provide further details on the proposed emissions to sewer and complete Table E.3(i). Include copies of any effluent discharge licence or other agreements with the sanitary authority.
- Specify by reference to EWC codes the quantity and nature of the wastes to be accepted. Indicate the proportions of household, commercial and industrial waste that will be putrescible and the source of this putrescible waste. Also indicate the breakdown between mixed and source segregated wastes.
- Provide further details relating to Class 12 re: non recoverable household, commercial and industrial waste to compacted and baled prior to consignment to off-site. Describe proposals and additional plant or processes involved.
- Give details of emissions to air and the effects on the environment in light of the proposed increase in waste tonnage. Provide proposals for environmental controls including controls for odour and dust emissions.
- Supply estimates of increases in energy, water and fuel consumption.
- Provide any details of groundwater monitoring and location of boreholes.
- Provide a copy of the AER for 2006.
- Under Part I of the Second Schedule of the Waste Management Licensing Regulations (2004), S.I. No. 395 of 2004, the fee for a review of a waste licence for *'the disposal of waste (other than hazardous waste) at a facility (other than a landfill facility) where the annual intake is less than 25,000 tonnes* is €6,000. The fee for a review of a waste licence for recovery of waste is €6,000. Therefore the appropriate fee for this application is €12,000. The amount received by the EPA was €10,000. Please submit the outstanding €2,000. I wish to point out that your application is not valid until the full fee is received by the Agency.




Your reply to this notice should include a revised non-technical summary, which reflects the information you supply in compliance with the notice, insofar as that information impinges on the non-technical summary.

In the case where any drawings already submitted are subject to revision consequent on this request, a revised drawing should be prepared in each case. It is not sufficient to annotate the original drawing with a textual correction. Where such revised drawings are submitted, provide a list of drawing titles, drawing numbers and revision status, which correlates the revised drawings with the superseded versions.

Please supply the information in the form of a one original plus two copies within **one month** of the date of this notice. In addition please submit two copies of the requested information in electronic searchable PDF format on a CD-ROM to the Agency. Please note that all maps/drawings should not exceed A3 in size.
