Dear Mr. Beale

I am to refer to our discussions on Wednesday 16th December in relation to waste licence W0192-02.

As pointed out at that meeting a technical amendment to your licence is not considered appropriate at this time given that the licence was granted on the information contained in the application which indicated that the waste oil, which is deemed hazardous, was to be sent onward to another licensed plant for further processing or incineration. It is understood that the purpose of your review application is to seek approval to the processing of waste oil on site to a particular specification at which time you have determined that it is a product and not a waste. Such a matter is for the Agency to determine, in due course, and in the interim the material should be considered a hazardous waste.

In the circumstances a review of your licence will be necessary if you are proposing to send the material for use as a fuel at another specified facility. The licensing process is the same as was previously undertaken by you for your current licence. The Agency website provides the necessary application forms and guidance that you require.

The information required for this licence review may include some of that already submitted to the Agency in respect of the earlier licences and in this regard should be updated to take account of any modelling or monitoring carried out in the interim. In support of your application you are requested to provide the following information:

- Details of the quality and quantity of the incoming waste oils to be used in the process.
- Description of the equipment, process, procedures, abatement and wastes generated
- Specification for the 'product' generated including proposed uses and the quality control and assurance systems in place.
- Address the issues of appropriateness of use, certainty of use, environmental impact of its use compared to other fuels including a comparison of its emissions and any processing which the 'user' may have to undertake prior to its use.
- Analysis of the 'product' and if available analysis of the emissions from the use of the 'product' in the specified applications.





Please submit the completed application to the Licensing Unit and I will arrange for the inspector to contact you with a view to having the application processed without undue delay.
