re: Notice in accordance with Article 8 of the Waste Management (Licensing)
Regulations

Dear Mr. O'Callaghan,

I am to refer to the above referenced application for a waste licence relating to a facility at O'Regan's Quarry Products, Tulligmore, Dripsey, Co.Cork. I am directed to advise you that the notices published and erected or fixed in relation to the application do not comply with Articles 6 and 7 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations 2004 (S.I. 395 of 2004).

- The notice published in respect of the application contravenes Article 6(d) and 6(e)(ii) of the regulations.
- The notice as erected or fixed on the facility or premises contravenes Article 7(3)(b) of the regulations.

The Agency therefore requires you, in accordance with Article 8 of the regulations, to

- 1. Publish an amended newspaper notice in accordance with Article 6 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations. This notice should be published in the newspaper which carried the original notice.
- 2. Replace the existing site notice with an amended notice that complies with Article 7 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations.
- 3. Give the relevant planning authority an amended written notice in accordance with Article 9 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations including specified amendments.

The Agency further requires you to submit the following evidence in relation to compliance with the above requirement:

1. An original of the newspaper and two copies of the relevant page of the newspaper in which the amended notice has been published.



- 2. An original and two copies of both a letter stating the date on which the amended site notice was fixed and a drawing showing its location on site.
- 3. An original and two copies of the text of the amended notice erected or fixed in accordance with Article 7.
- 4. An original and two copies of the amended written notice to the relevant planning authority in accordance with Article 9.

Maintain the notice as amended at a location complying with Article 7 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations for a period of two months following the making of the specified amendment.

The evidence requested should be submitted within two weeks of the date of this notice, in the form of one original plus two copies. In addition submit two copies in electronic searchable PDF format on a CD-ROM to the Agency. Please note that all drawings/maps should not exceed A3 in size.
