The following changes to Waste Licence W0001-03 are proposed by Kerry County Council to be taken in consideration by the Agency during forthcoming licence review.

Changes Proposed:

Part1: Schedule of Activities Licensed

Addition of the following Classes to Licenced Waste Disposal Activities, in accordance with the Fourth Schedule of the Waste Management Acts 1996 to 2003

Class 9 Use of any waste principally as a fuel or other means to generate

electricity.

Reason: To allow for methane gas produced as a result of the waste to be used

to generate electricity on site.

Removal of the following from Part II: Schedule of Activities Refused.

Class 9 Use of any waste principally as a fuel or other means to generate

electricity.

Reason: To allow for methane gas produced as a result of the waste to be used

to generate electricity on site.

Change to Part III Condition 1.5 Waste Acceptance Hours and Hours of Operation

Proposed Change to Condition 1.5.1 Landfill to the following:

- 1.5.1.1 Waste may be accepted at the facility for the disposal at the landfill between the hours of:0830 to 1700 Monday to Friday inclusive0830 to 1300 on Saturday
- 1.5.1.2 The landfill at the facility may be operated during the hours of: 0800 to 1800 Monday to Friday inclusive 0800 to 1600 on Saturdays
- 1.5.1.3 Waste shall not be accepted at the landfill site on Sunday's and public holidays.

Reason:

Please note that the proposed operational hours are as per the original licence the only proposed change is the change of the word "bank holiday" to "public holiday". This allows for the landfill site to operate on Good Friday.

Proposed change to Condition 3 Facility Infrastructure

Removal of condition:

3.14.3 All structures for the storage and/or treatment of leachate shall be fully enclosed except for the inlet and outlet piping.

Reason:

the leachate lagoons on site (three in total) are not enclosed they are open fully lined lagoons. There is only one enclosed leachate tank onsite which is being built as part of the new phase 9 development.

Removal of Condition:

3.15.3 Any vents installed to facilitate the passive venting of landfill gas shall be fitted and maintained with an effective activated carbon filter.

Reason:

Passive wells are no longer being built up in the waste body as the active cell is filled, instead horizontal gas extraction pipes are installed in the waste body as it fills and these are directly connected to the flare and are active as the cell is being filled.

Addition of the following condition to Condition 5.10 Leachate Management

5.10.7 The heating and evaporation of leachate or other contaminated water shall not be undertaken without prior agreement with Agency.

Reason:

This allows for the use of heat a by product of electricity generation from the landfill gas to be used to reduce the quantities of leachate being exported off site.

Proposed change to Condition 6 Emissions

Removal of the TOC from Condition 6.5.3 Emissions to Surface Water to read as following:

6.5.3 The licensee shall carry out continuous monitoring in the surface water/groundwater retention ponds. Such continuous monitoring shall include conductivity, pH and shall be carried out at the inlet to the ponds. No discharge from these ponds shall take place once the trigger levels are agreed by the Agency have been breached.

Reason:

The Agency has already agreed the use of turbidity meters in lieu of TOC metres for the new surface water lagoon under construction in Phase 9.

Proposed change to Condition 7 Nuisance Control

Addition of the following to Condition 7.6 Bird Control

7.6.2 The use of gas-operated bird scaring devices shall be minimised at the facility, however they may be used outside the hours of operation in exceptional circumstance. The maximum operational period for operation is from 0800 to 2000

Reason

Although other bird scaring devices are deployed during out of operational hours it may be necessary at times of high bird traffic to use the gas operated bird scaring device so as to ensure that waste from the active cell is not being removed from the site by the birds.

Proposed change to Schedule A: Waste Acceptance
