Hi Caroline,

Apologies for not getting back to you sooner. I have been in and out of the office in the last few days.

The conversion rate from tonnes to cubic metres is dependant on how well the waste is compacted when placed. This can vary with the type of waste, the time of year, the type of plant being used and the rate of infilling occurring. We have worked out compaction rates from Ballaghveny Landfill in the past based on topographical surveys and tonnages recorded. We have found the average conversion to be approximately 0.75t/m³. This rate would be comparable with other similar landfills.

Therefore the figure of 344,685 tonnes provided can be converted to 446,246m³.
