I object to the granting of above licence on the
grounds of air pollution.

My objection is based on the fact that during
waste there is degrading food there is bad odour.

To meet national By-Products Regulations

requirements certain disinfectants will be required
at the site (H) raw materials (e.g. 1000 kg)

The odour of this disinfectant will hang in
the air over the site and indeed far

beyond the site's boundary, being subject
to wind-direction on each day. At the

very least this will cause discomfort to
local residents, and especially the school-

children nearby, but in more sensitive
cases it could cause breathing difficulties,

nausea or even infection.

In answer to my question at a public meeting in
Tibohine on 12th June 2010, a spokesman for

ADP Peter Roscommon Limited vehemently denied that
any such chemical disinfectant will be used
on site.
