Re Waste Licence Application No WEL74-01

I object to the granting of above licence on
the grounds of possible water pollution.

I base my objection on the fact that there
is a stream which flows under the road outside
the former Post Office premises and again flows
under the N5 a hundred yards or so, west of
Tubehine N.S. and continues north-westward in
the case of the ^{proposed} waste plant. It is
possible that some of the ground surface
water around the waste facility may find
its way into this stream and thence to
Lough Gara, the source of our domestic
and drinking water supply.

A further comment I wish to make is - ADP
persists in calling the proposed enterprise "Bio-Park".
Of course nothing in a name can effect the
actual environment but it can project a
distorted image. "Park" is defined as "Public
garden or recreation ground" or "Enclosed land of
a country house" or "Parking area"; the proposed
enterprise fits none of those definitions.

"Bio-Park" signifies one of those defined above which
contains only biological matter.
