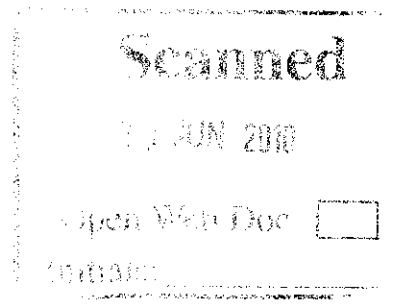

Re: Waste Licence Application No. W0274-01

I object to the granting of the above licence on the grounds of human health.
I base my objection on the fact that certain elements such as metals (mercury),
chemicals (antibiotics), steroids also hormones contained in the waste materials listed
here are nonbiodegradable:- i.e. E.W.C. Codes 020201, 020106, 020203,
020204,020299, 020501, 020502, 020599.

I further submit that certain elements such as pesticides used in agriculture and
horticulture may be nonbiodegradable i.e. EWC. codes 020103, 020301, 020304,
020305, 020399, 020201.

In answer to my question at a public meeting in Tibohine on 12th June '10 a
spokesman for AD Power Roscommon Limited confirmed that all residue of the
anaerobic plant will be spread on land, thus re- admitting it to the human food chain.
