Re: Waste Licence Application No. W0274-01

I object to the granting of the above licence on the grounds of air pollution. My objection is based on the fact that always where there is decaying food there is bad odour. 'To meet Animal By-Products Regulations requirements certain disinfectants will be required at the site' ((h)Raw Materials page 4 of 11 W.L.App). The odour of this disinfectant will hang in the air over the site and indeed far beyond the site's boundary, being subject to wind-direction on each day. At the very least this will cause discomfort to local residents and especially the school-children nearby but in more sensitive cases it could cause breathing difficulties, nausea or lung infection. In answer to my question at the public meeting in Tibohine on the 12<sup>th</sup> June 2010 a spokesman for AD Power Roscommon Limited vehemently denied that any such chemical disinfectant will be used on site.
