The Environmental Protection 12.6 JUL 2010 This is the response to the Agency's request of 29/06/2010 for information under Article 17(1) of the EPA (Licensing) Regulations 1994 to 2008. I have been asked by the Applicant Mr. Paul Tully of Moate Pig Unit, Ballinakill, Rortlaoise, Co. Laois to assist in drafting this response which is submitted on his behalf.

In April 2004 PJ Cahill Farm Limited applied to the EPA for an IPC licence (application received by the Agency 28/4/2004). This application was accompanied by an EIS (15 hard copies) received by the Agency on \$2/67/2004 (see cover page attached as downloaded from the EPA web-site). The Licence Register Number for this application was 710-01. An electronic copy of the EIS is available on the EPA website. Given that this EIS is available on the websitent is not considered necessary to re-submit it. If the Agency disagrees with this they may request a copy to be re-submitted.

The EIS was submitted to Laois County Council in support of a planning application for the pig unit operated by PJ Cahill Farms Limited (Planning reference 04/886). The management of animal manure has been regulated subsequent to this EIS being submitted and accordingly sections of it would need to be amended to give proper regard to the provisions in S.I. 252 of 2008 and S.I. 253 of 2008 that classify manure as Category 2 byproduct, authorise sale or supply and transfer of manure from producers for use as organic fertiliser or soil improver and the provisions in S.I. 101 of 2009 that assign responsibility for all aspects of the use of the manure/fertiliser to the occupier of the holding on which it is deposited on land.

On 16/6/2006 a planning application was submitted to Laois County Council in support of a planning application "to replace the existing service house with a new finishing house and two meal bin silos such that the capacity of the unit shall accommodate all progeny of the existing 620 sow herd to slaughter". The planning reference number for this application was 06/918. A copy of this grant of planning permission and associated conditions was included in the IPPC licence application.
