I refer to your letter dated 3 July 2010. In your letter you requested clarification on a number of issues. Each of the points raised are addressed below:

- 1 The EPA is not claiming that the EIS does not have to contain the information specified under Article 5 of the EIA Directive or Paragraph 1 of Schedule 6 of the Planning Regulations 2001. The original EIS from 2000 was updated by a further EIS in 2008 both of which will be considered.
- 2 The Mr. Binman site at Luddenmore is not unauthorised. The site currently holds a waste licence (W0061-02). The Agency has requested the applicant to provide all relevant information in accordance with Article 12 of Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations, S.I. 395 of 2004.
- 3 The EPA acknowledges that all relevant legislation should be complied with and that a waste licence does not exempt a site from a requirement to obtain relevant planning permission. Section 40 of the Waste Management Act, 1996 applies.
- 4 Mr. Binman is not an unauthorised facility. The facility operates under a waste licence. An application for a review of this waste licence is currently under assessment. The Agency does not take the view suggested in your letter dated 3 July 2010. The Agency does not agree that it is violating the ECJ judgement.
- 5 The Agency does not accept that it is violating the ECJ judgement.
- 6 Mr. Binman provided a response to the Agency letter of 27 April 2010. This information is currently under assessment and therefore compliance with Article 12

7 The Agency does not accept that, for the purposes of waste licensing, the original EIS and the updated EIS are not in compliance with the EIA Directive.
