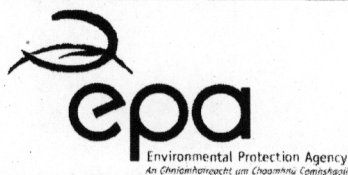

Jim and Mark Wright (t/a/ JMW Farms), 52 Cortynan Road, Tynan, Co. Armagh, BT60 4QZ submitted a licence review application under Class 6.2 of the First Schedule of the EPA Acts 1992 to 2007, to rear pigs in an installation where the capacity exceeds 285 places for sows in an integrated unit, at Crosses, Monaghan, Co Monaghan. The IPPC licence review Application Form was received on the 21<sup>st</sup> June 2010, for the review of the existing IPPC Licence (Reg. No. P0696-01) which was granted on the 20<sup>th</sup> January 2005. Further information in support of the licence review application was received on the 15<sup>th</sup> September 2010,

In support of the licence review application, received on the 21<sup>st</sup> June 2010, was information labelled as 'confidential'. The information labelled as 'confidential' relates to the capacity of identified lands to use pig slurry as a fertiliser.

The confidential information comprises of details of the customer farms, specifically: farm code, available land area (ha), stocking rate on the farm, maximum slurry import volume (m<sup>3</sup>). Calculations of the volume of slurry which may be imported are based on a maximum of 170kg/ha organic nitrogen.

The applicant included as part of the IPPC Application Form (i.e. in non-confidential format) summary details of slurry generated at the installation, 1:50,000 location map identifying the farms that may receive slurry, a summary table with the farm customer code, townlands/address and manure requirement for the identified farm and a declaration that animal manure may be used to fertilise the identified farmlands in accordance with the European Communities (Good Agricultural Practice for Protection of Waters) Regulations 2009, (S.I. 101 of 2009).

**Recommendation**

The information labelled as "Confidential" is essential for the processing of the application, however; it is not considered necessary for the Agency to retain the confidential information submitted.

The information labelled as "Confidential" may be returned to the applicant following assessment by the inspector and issue of the final determination, however the information shall be updated as necessary by the applicant/licensee and maintained at the installation.
