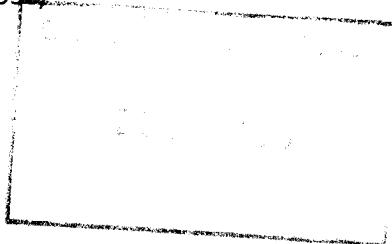

Dear Ms. Sullivan & Ms. Leacy:

We refer to our letter of 11<sup>th</sup> November last concerning the above and other Applications for Transfer of IPPC Licences as set out in that letter and following on from the telephone discussion held between Wyeth Medica Ireland (WMI) personnel (Edward Molyneux) and Agency Inspector Gavin Clabby on 10<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2010. We are writing to inform you for the sake of clarity that in the case of two of the licensed entities referred to in our letter of 11<sup>th</sup> November the transfer of the licences in question will not be necessary. These facilities are:

- Shanbally [P0864-01] - Pfizer Biotechnology Ireland; and,
- Little Island [P0103-02] - Pfizer Cork Limited.

The reason for this is that these two facilities are owned by separate corporate entities to those involved in the current corporate re-structuring namely the Pfizer Ireland Pharmaceuticals partnership and AHP Manufacturing BV and therefore because of the nature of that re-structuring, do not require to be transferred to a new entity and will remain in the ownership of the Pfizer companies that currently own and operate them.
